COMMUNITY COMMENTS:

<u>Public Comment (Items Not on Presented Agenda):</u> Residents present from 420 S. Giles St. were present to address the council regarding a water leak in their area. It was stated that multiple requests had been made to the city water department to investigate the leak, without resolution. The water leak is causing an infestation of mosquitos in the area, as well as road deterioration due to excessive water.

Another matter was also brought to council's attention regarding a property nearby, 417 S. Giles, and the excess of rodents and pests.

Mayor Johnston apologized for the residents having to bring these matters before the council in order to get the issues resolved but assured them these matters would be addressed promptly.

1. Main Street Gentry Chamber of Commerce – Janie Parks presented her monthly report to the council which included: The Veteran's Day Ceremony to be held Friday, November 11, 2022 at 10:45 a.m. at the Gentry Police Department. The Christmas parade is scheduled for December 10, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. and the Gentry Chamber of Commerce Quilt Show will be January 13th - 20th, 2023 in the McKee Room of the Gentry Public Library.

Janie also mentioned that this year's trick or treat on Main Street was another success, having 1,140 children this year. She also expressed her gratitude to all of the city workers for replacing the flags along Main Street prior to Veteran's Day.



A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING AND ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF GENTRY FOR THE YEAR COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 2023, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2023, AND APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR EACH AND EVERY ITEM OF EXPENDITURE THEREIN PROVIDED FOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Gentry has made a comprehensive study and review of the proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council that the schedules and exhibits of financial information prepared and reviewed revealing anticipated revenues and expenditures for the calendar year appear to be as accurate as possible for budgetary purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council for the City of Gentry, Arkansas:

- **Section 1.** This Resolution shall be known as the Budget Resolution for the City of Gentry, Arkansas, for the twelve (12) month period beginning January 1, 2023, and ending December 31, 2023, reflecting estimated revenues and expenditures as hereinafter set forth on the succeeding pages. All revenues herein are estimated and subject to change and all appropriations are calculated upon available revenues.
- **Section 2.** The respective amounts of funds for each and every item of expenditure classification herein proposed in the budget for 2023 are hereby approved by the City of Gentry, Arkansas, and are hereby authorized and appropriated for the purposes set forth for the calendar year ending December 31, 2023.

Section 3.

- (a) The Mayor or his duly authorized representative may approve for payment out of funds hereby appropriated for that purpose, or disapprove any bills, debts, or liabilities asserted as claims against the City;
- **(b)** The maximum amount allowable under the laws of the State of Arkansas is hereby authorized for such expenditure, subject to any more restrictive Ordinance previously enacted. The payment or disapproval of any bills, debts, or liabilities exceeding the statutory amount as in effect from time to time shall require the confirmation of the governing body.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF GENTRY TO EXECUTE PURCHASE AGREEMENTS TO PURCHASE TWO USED POLICE PATROL VEHICLES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Gentry is in need of two additional patrol vehicles;

WHEREAS, the City has located a 2014 Chevy Tahoe and a 2019 Dodge Charger (the "Vehicles") from Chicago Motors that are currently available for purchase at reasonable prices (draft bills of sale attached);

WHEREAS, sufficient funds to purchase the Vehicles are included in the 2023 Budget, but market conditions are such that it is not prudent to wait until January 2023 to purchase the Vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the competitive bidding is waived for used motor vehicles under Ark. Code Ann. § 14-58-104(11).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Gentry, Arkansas:

- Section 1. The Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to execute purchase agreements with Chicago Motors for the purchase of the Vehicles in the amounts of \$16,995 for the 2014 Chevy Tahoe and \$18,995 for the 2019 Dodge Charger, together with ancillary taxes and fees.
- Section 2. In the event one or both of the Vehicles are no longer available upon approval of this Resolution, the Mayor or his designee is authorized to purchase two similarly specced patrol cars from Chicago Motors, provided the aggregate purchase price for said vehicles does not exceed \$40,000.

AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE SALARIES OF THE ELECTED OFFICIALS AND PLANNING COMMISSION MEMBERS OF THE CITY OF GENTRY, ARKANSAS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Arkansas law requires that the salaries of certain elected officials in cities of the first class be established by ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council for the City of Gentry, Arkansas:

Section 1. Effective January 1, 2023, the annual compensation for Gentry elected officials and Planning Commission members shall be as shown below:

Section 2. All Ordinances or Resolutions in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of said conflict.

Section 3. Emergency Clause. It is hereby declared that an emergency exists, and this ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Gentry, Arkansas, shall be effective January 1, 2023.
